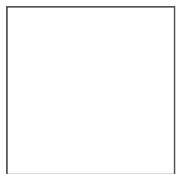

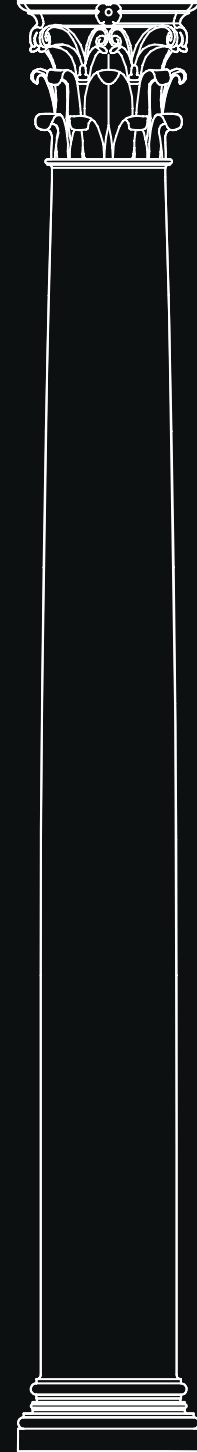

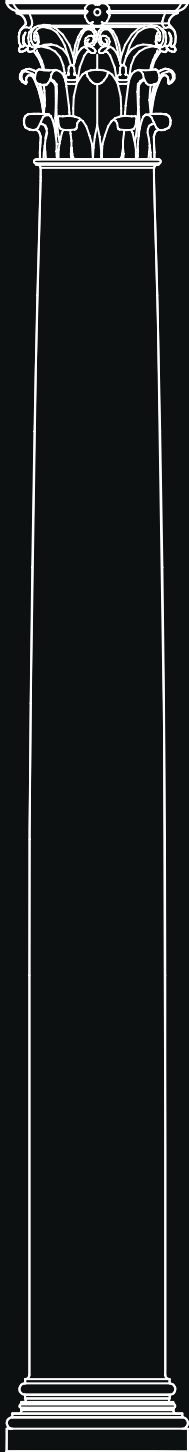


WHEN IN ROME / FONTANA DI TREVI

Since its completion in 1762, the Trevi Fountain in its current form has generously carried its well of rich Roman history and architectural heritage through the centuries. The site of the fountain has long played a significant role in the city's growth and prosperity. Since 19 BCE, its natural spring water has flowed through one of the oldest Roman aqueducts, the Acqua Vergine (Virgin Waters).

A breathtaking work of Baroque art, the fountain manifests Roman resourcefulness with a cornucopia of sculptures and symbolic tributes to ancient deities, Roman legends and visionaries, and the abundance of the natural world. Its name, derived from *tre vie* (three roads), highlights its strategic location at the intersection of three ancient streets, once guiding pilgrims and citizens – and now around 10 million visitors a year.

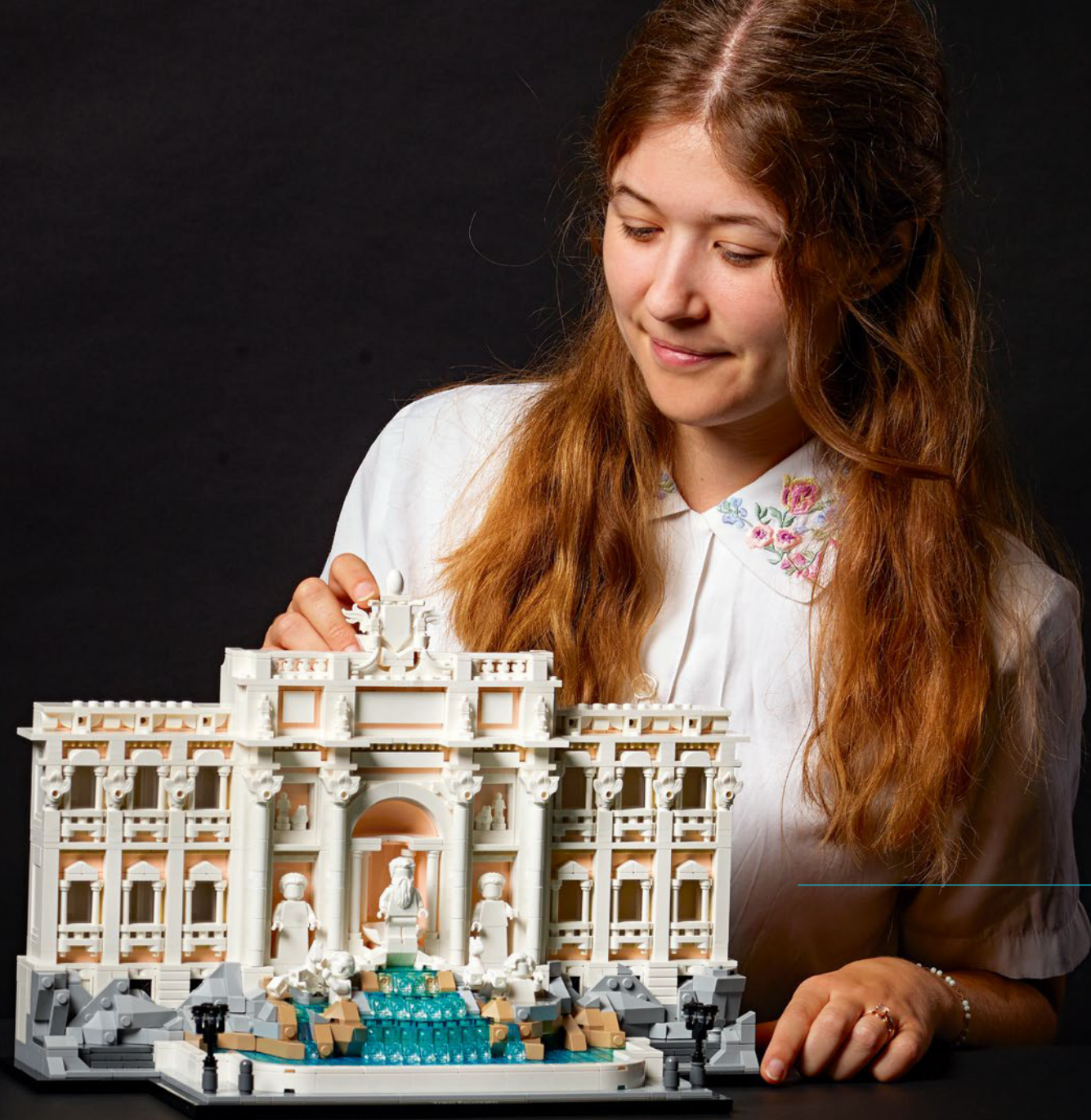




FROM THE LEGO® ARCHITECTURE DESIGN TEAM

More than a visual gem, as a cultural icon the Trevi Fountain has inspired countless works of art, literature and even films. Following the popular 2014 LEGO® Architecture Trevi Fountain (21020) set, this version revisits the site at a grander scale as an interpretation of the real-life structure, with some details abstracted to fit the scene.

The main goal was to capture the Baroque ambience and atmosphere in Rome on a summer's day, with the vibrant-coloured buildings surrounding the Trevi Fountain reflecting a warm light over the piazza. The depths within the facade cast shadows upon themselves and the basin, creating subtle variances in the surface colours. Using hues of pink, tan, grey and white, we wanted to capture the essence of these intricate nuances in the building, statues, water and rockwork.

PALAZZO POLI

The coat of arms of Pope Clemens XII, who commissioned the Trevi Fountain, is flanked by four statues representing fruits and crops fertilised by the water.



OCEANUS (NEPTUNE)

The god of the seas, riding a shell-shaped chariot pulled by mythical hippocampi (sea-horses), symbolising Roman engineering expertise in controlling water through aqueducts.

AGRIPPA

Roman general and architect Marcus Vipsanius Agrippa (63-12 BCE) is shown approving the plans for the original aqueduct's construction.



THE VIRGIN

A tribute to the young girl who, according to myth, pointed out the spring to Roman soldiers millennia ago.



SALUBRITY (SALUS)

The goddess of health holds a cup to allow a snake to drink, symbolising the purity and healing powers of the water.



ABUNDANTIA

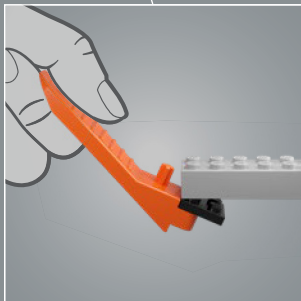
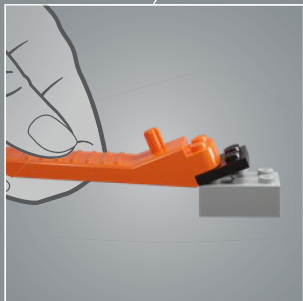
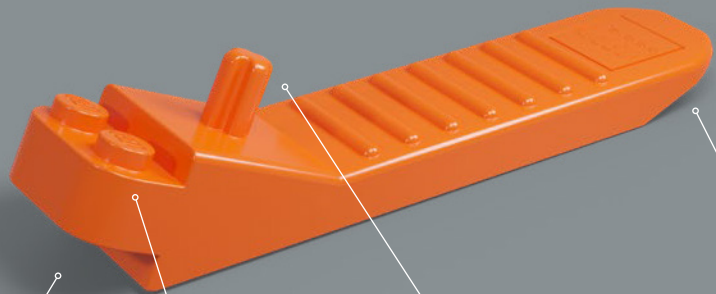
The goddess of abundance pours water from a large urn, symbolising the flow of water from the aqueducts and the fertility it brings to the land.



TRITONS

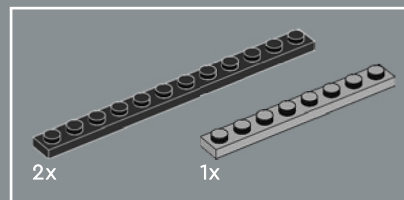
Mythical half-man, half-fish sea creatures. One struggles to control a wild hippocampus (the turbulent nature of the sea), the other guides a calm hippocampus (the waters under Roman control).



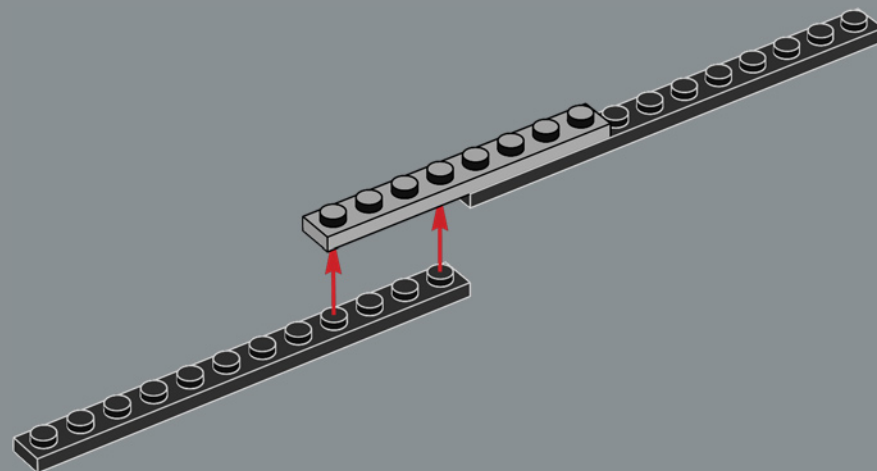


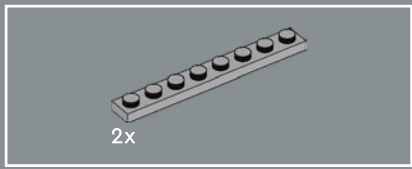

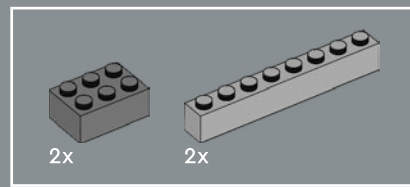




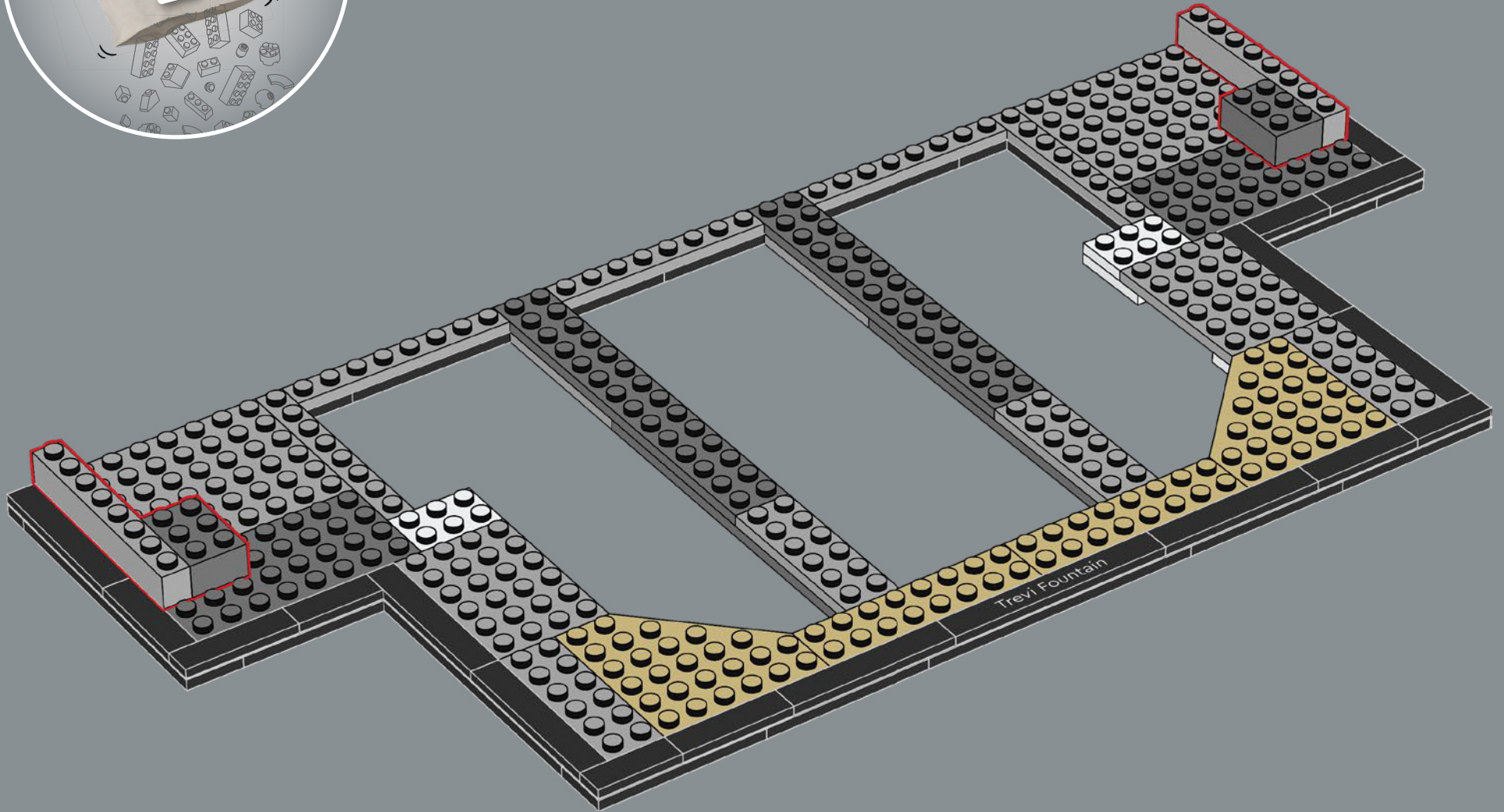
Over the centuries, the 'three roads' that led to and inspired the name of the Trevi Fountain have expanded. Five roads now lead to the famous piazza.

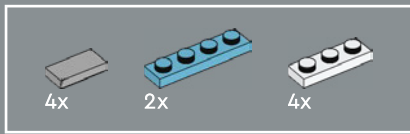

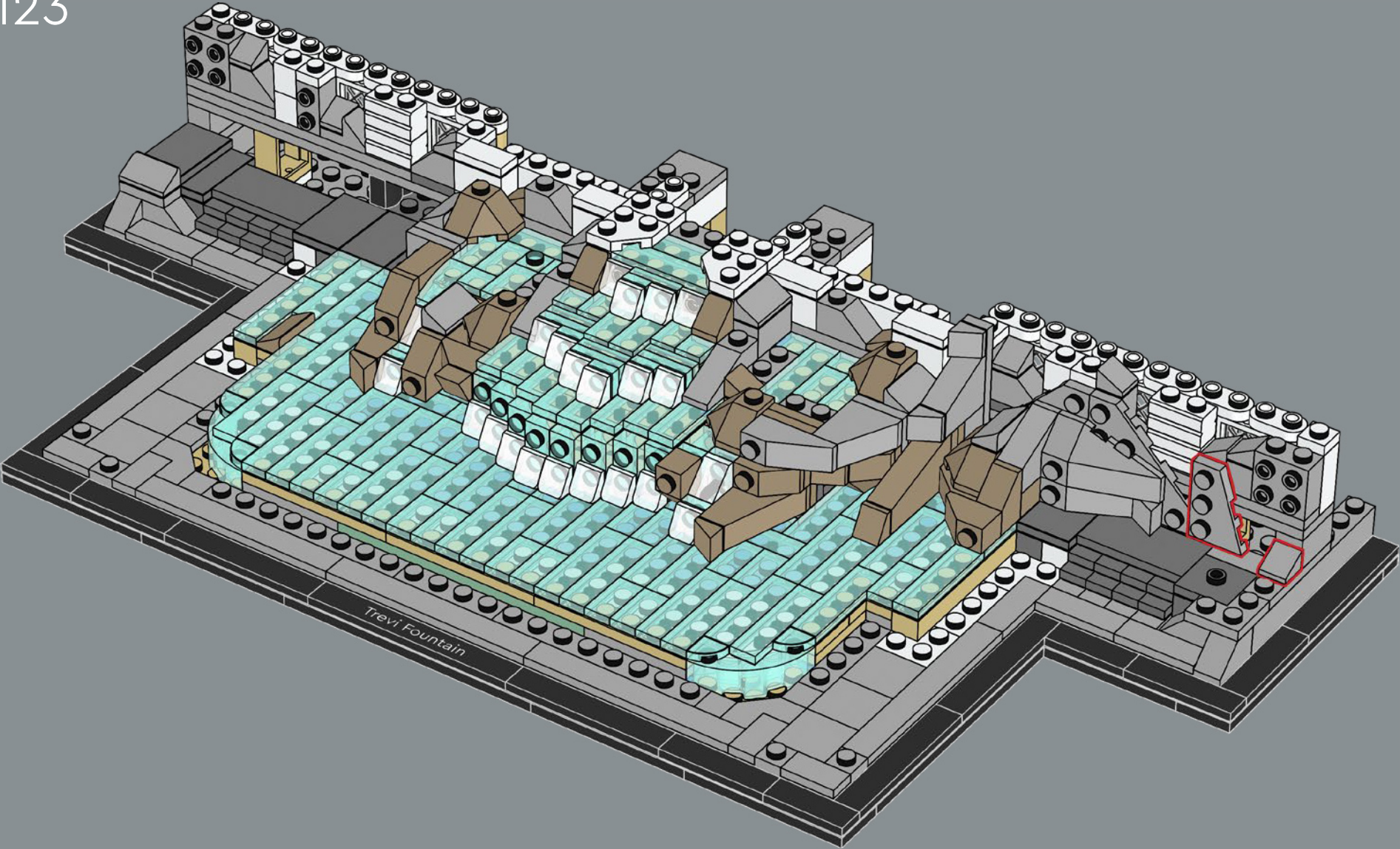


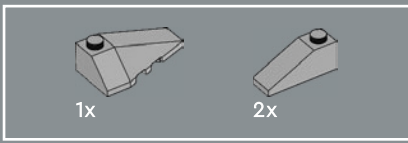
The rockwork is one of the few details that disrupts the overall symmetry of the Baroque structure, while adding a stunning contrast to the rest of the facade with its organic shapes.



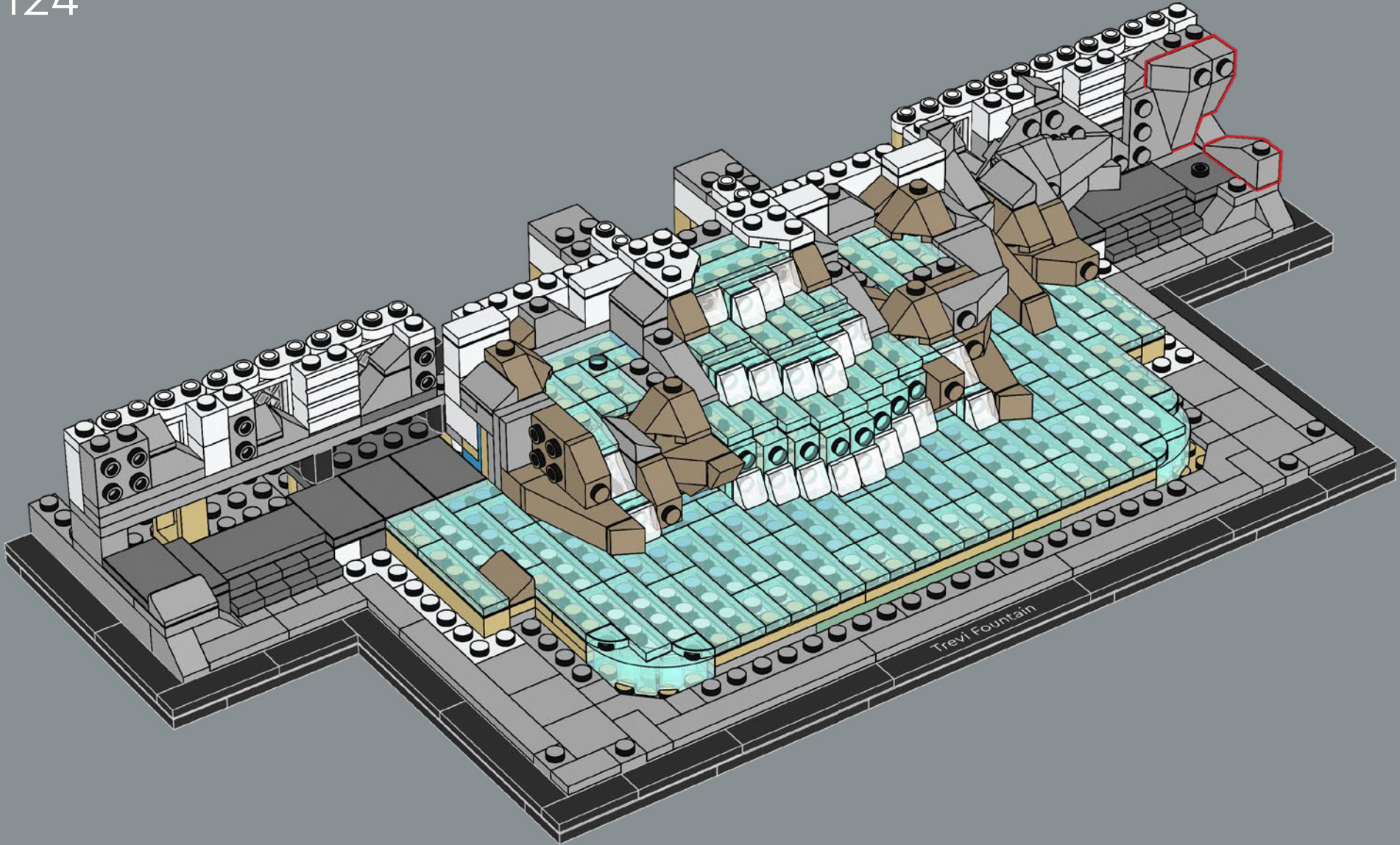


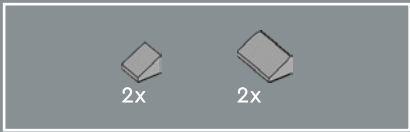

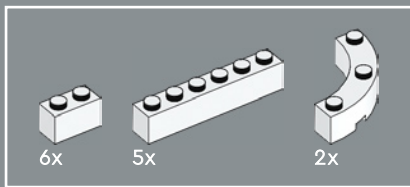
Even the wear and tear of the fountain plays a role in how it is viewed. Environmental degradation catches in the nooks and crannies of the carved facade, leaving even shallow engravings darker in colour than the surrounding rock.



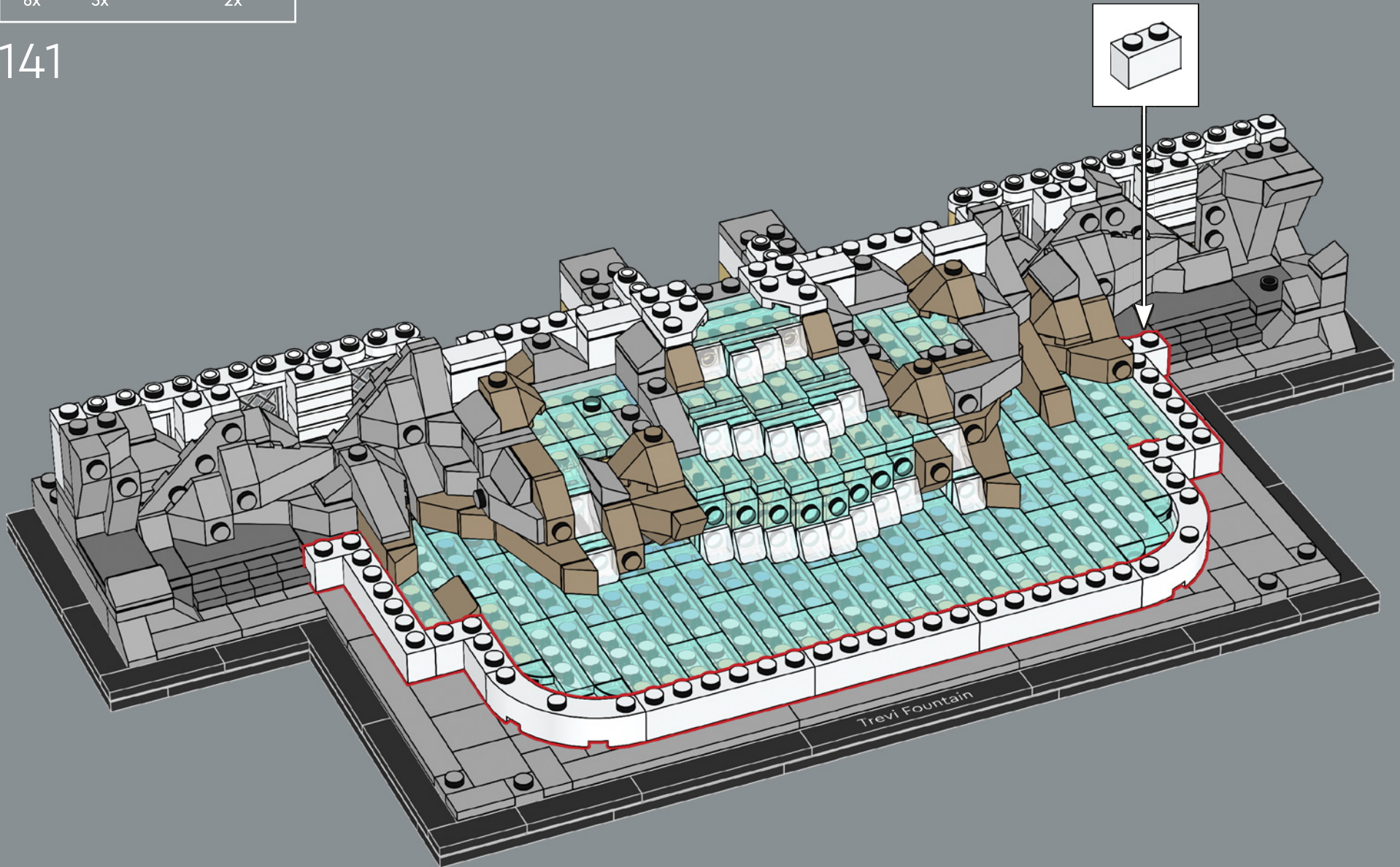


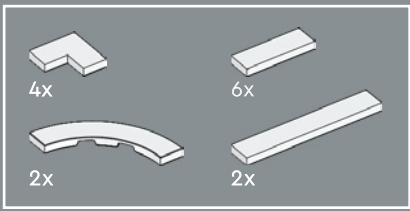

To properly capture the details and spacing in the overhangs and offset portions of the facade, we jumped back and forth between the standard LEGO® grid and 1/2 plate off the grid. This helped us create a smooth building flow and a strong construction.
